6.3. Case Study: The Design of a Cultural Revolution

You don't need an army. You need a small group that controls the key contexts:

1. ***Education:***

Change the curriculum to normalize certain concepts in new generations.

2. ***Media:***

Promoting a specific vocabulary and marginalizing another as 'offensive' or 'backward'.

3. ***Law:***

Enact regulations that make it economically costly or legally dangerous to behave in the 'old' way.

In a generation, the context will have changed so much that the old way of thinking will seem archaic and unthinkable. People will have changed, not through conversion, but through adaptation to the new environment. 3. The Wizard/Sorcerer:

It represents hidden knowledge, transformation, and access to the mysterious and forbidden. Activation: It is activated by the promise of a secret, a miraculous solution, a revolutionary technology, or a change of identity. Startups that promise to "disrupt" an industry or cults that offer "enlightenment" utilize this archetype.

4. The Victim/Savior:

It represents suffering innocence, the need for rescue, and guilt. Activation: This is the most powerful and dangerous archetype. It is activated by pointing out an injustice, oppression, or collective pain. Those who position themselves as the Victim seek a Savior, and those who position themselves as the Savior gain unlimited power over those they "redeem."

8.2. Archetypal Engineering in Practice

A boring political speech about public policy doesn't mobilize anyone. But a speech that activates the Warrior (we will fight against the

corrupt elites!), the Savior (I will protect the poor), and the Victim (we have been betrayed) can ignite a country. The master is a DJ of archetypes.
